

Uniform

If for any reason your child is not wearing the correct school uniform, please inform the class teacher of the reason why.

To help prevent accidents, please ensure that your children do not wear shoes that have high or deep heels, or that are open backed. As far as possible, shoes should be flat bottomed to help to ensure your child's safety around school. Earrings should be restricted to one per ear and should be studs only. All earrings must be removed for PE lessons or you must provide your children with plasters to cover their studs if they cannot remove their own earrings.

We would like to thank those parents who have ensured that their children have the correct PE kit for lessons. However, it has once again come to our attention that not all children are regularly bringing in their PE kit or in some cases not wearing the correct kit. It is very important that your child is in the correct kit and footwear for their lesson. If your child forgets their kit or is not in the correct kit, then they will be provided with spare kit to wear for their PE lesson and a letter will be sent home to inform you.

Milk Money

Milk money, if milk is required for the Spring Term, is £12- to be paid, in full, by Friday 12th January 2018 via Parentpay or Paypoint. If your child has free school meals then milk is free of charge.

Good to be Green



The changes to the Good to be Green system, with more of a focus on the platinum and gold cards have been really successful. Below is an overview of the number of cards given out last term.

School Meals Reminders...

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 (Early Years and Key Stage 1) are entitled to a free school meal via the Universal Free School Meal Programme.

Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 (Key Stage 2) must pay for their meals (unless they meet the criteria for a free school meal).

A school meal costs **£2.40 (£12.00 per week)**. If your child requires a school meal then this **must** be paid for in advance. This can be paid for via **Parentpay or Paypoint**. Where appropriate payment is not received, nor a packed lunch provided, the front office will phone parents to advise them that they must make a payment on parentpay /paypoint or provide a packed lunch before lunchtime as meals will not be provided.

Your child may be entitled to free school meals, if you would like to find out more please contact the school office.



Going Cashless...

A reminder that with effect from the New Year – 2nd January 2018, Perry Hall Primary School will not be accepting any cash payments direct to school.

You will be able to credit your child's cashless account (including school meals, trips, residential visits and extended services) in one of two ways:

• **Via Parentpay-** our convenient and secure online payment method using a credit or debit card.

We continue to thank those of you who use this system and encourage those of you who have still not activated your account to do so at your earliest convenience.
