

English

We are going to be looking at books written by the famous children's author, Julia Donaldson, including The Scarecrows' Wedding and Paper Dolls, and writing different genres such as character descriptions, diary entries, letters, an extra chapter and a book review. Following this we will then look at different types of writing based on our topic of The Great Fire of London which will include newspaper reports, letters from eye-witnesses, Samuel Pepys' diary, descriptive writing, reports and instructions.

After half-term, our focus text will be 'Where the poppies now grow' by Hilary Robinson and Martin Impey where we will learn about World War One and write diary entries, newspaper reports, descriptive writing and radio-scripts.

Mathematics

We will begin the year focusing on place value, including reading and writing numbers and comparing and ordering 2 and 3-digit numbers. Once secure, we will shift our focus to number. We will learn addition and subtraction facts up to 20 and solve problems using these operations, both mentally and written. We will then study the properties of 2D shapes including pentagons, hexagons and octagons and later symmetry. Position, direction and movement will be learnt as well as interpreting and constructing tally charts and block graphs from which we will ask and answer questions about them.

Science

Science is about 'Changing Materials' including exploring the characteristics of them; natural and man-made materials; changing the shapes of materials; heating and cooling and undertaking scientific investigations. In the second half of the term, areas covered will include forces and magnets.

History:

The Great Fire of London is our topic for the first half of the term. We will learn about what happened in the Great Fire; why the fire spread so fast; why cities are safer today; Samuel Pepys' diary and other witnesses accounts; rebuilding London and using different building materials to do so. World War One will be our topic for the second half of the term.

Geography:

In Geography, we will be learning about weather throughout the seasons, and the location and characteristics of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. Wolverhampton (a familiar location) will be also be studied. D&T /Art/Music:

In Art, we will be painting pictures of the Great Fire; looking at the difference between paintings and photographs and creating our own compositions of the significant event. We will also be experimenting with charcoal. In D.T. we will research, design, and create a bridge for a toy car to travel across, evaluating it once complete. Mr Womble will be leading our music this term.

Computing:

In Computing, we will be using Digital Animator to make our own digital figure using Pivot Animator. This figure will be used in a storyboard and before presenting to the class. E-safety will also form an important part of this subject.

RE:

Our learning in RE this term is centered around Islam and the areas covered are as follows: what is a leader; a mosque and other religious places of worship in our community; sacred books and festivals and what matters to Muslims and ourselves.

P.E./Games:

Football and Dance will be our areas of focus in PE in the first half of the term, and netball and gymnastics in the second half.

PSHE:

During the whole term, PSHE will include New Beginnings, Feelings, Getting on and Falling Out and Bullying. As part of our Social, Moral ,Spiritual and Cultural curriculum we will continue to interweave our school motto and core values into everything we do. Motto:
