E-SAFETY REMINDERS

SNAPCHAT

Snapchat is an app that lets you send a photo, short video or message to your contacts. The 'snap' appears on screen for up to 10 seconds before disappearing, or there is an option to have no time limit. A Snapchat Story can let you share a sequence for up to 24 hours.

A further feature of Snapchat is Snap Maps. This allows you share your location with your friends and it also allows you to scroll around an actual map to see where your friends are located. This feature is automatically on and requires you (the user) to change the settings to Ghost Mode to hide where you are.

PARENTAL CONTROLS FOR APPLE PRODUCTS

You will find the following instructions useful if your child has access to an iPhone or iPad. Using automatic settings (as well as the blacklist feature) you can prevent your children from clicking on links leading to insecure sites.

1. Start the **Setting app** from the Home screen and tap **General**.
2. Then tap **Restrictions** and proceed with **Enable Restrictions**.
3. Come up with a 4-digit **password** and enter it two times.
4. Under **Allowed Content**, tap on **Websites**.
5. Under the **Allowed Websites** section, tap on **Limit Adult Content**.
6. Under **Never Allow**, pick **Add a Website** and type the URL of the site.
7. Once you finished, tap **Done**.

You will need to repeat the same steps for each website you'd like to limit the access to. Using Safari child protection features is a quick and simple way to ensure basic protection from objectionable content on Mac and Apple mobile devices for your kids.

BE SHARE AWARE

It can be hard to keep track of what your child is doing on social networks, apps and games. Or know how to keep them safe. That's why the NSPCC have teamed up with O2 to provide parents with information and guidance about the internet and to help you teach your children to be 'Share Aware'.

3 tips to help start the conversation

1. Explore sites and apps together and talk about any concerns.
2. Ask your child if they know how to stay safe online.
3. Talk about personal information and what to share online.
