Helping Your Child At Home

We will continue to set homework in Maths and English that should be completed and returned on Wednesdays. New homework will be given out on Friday.

The Maths homework is based on the topic we have been learning about that week, the children should be able to complete the tasks set but you can help by asking them to explain to you what they need to do, so that they can show you they understand the task. Also My Maths homework will be updated each week so that you can practice Maths skills with them on electronic devices.

English homework is reading comprehension, to help your child with this you can discuss words that they find tricky or new vocabulary with them. You could also talk through the question, with your child explaining to you what they think they need to do.

As well as this new spellings are sent out each week to be learned and to find other words that contain the same spelling rule.

Reading with your child at home should include the home reader books they choose at school. To help your child you could ask them some questions about the characters, plot, setting or information they have learned.

During SATs please ensure that your child has a good nights sleep, a hearty breakfast and is as calm as possible before coming into school.

The tests are nothing to worry about and we have been working with your child to prepare them as best as we can.

English

In our English lessons we will be learning all about our topic of flight with both fiction and non-fiction resources. We will be looking at fiction books such as 'The owl who was afraid of the Dark' along with others. As well as this, we will be using non-fiction resources to help us with research for our factual writing. We will be producing exciting writing including: non-chronological reports, newspaper reports, instructions, letters, character and setting descriptions, leaflets and stories.

In our spelling, grammar and punctuation we will be focusing on using the skills we have learned so far and will be showing these in our writing. We will also continue to set our new spellings each week.

Numeracy

During the Summer term we will be working on mathematical word problems involving the 4 operations (I-step and 2-step) as well as completing topics about money, measurement including capacity, temperature, and mass, estimating, sequences, place value, data handling using graphs, time, 2D and 3D shapes. We will be continuing to complete our arithmetic sessions in order to continue to develop our skills of the 4 mathematical operations (+-/x). calculations.

We will continue to practice our counting and recall of the x2,x3,x5 & x10

Curriculum News / topics

Art: Will be linked to our flight topic as we will be using our sketching skills to create pictures of hot air balloons and we will be developing our painting skills with painting bird pictures.

Computing: During our computing sessions we will be focusing on creating music for different moods. We will use programs to help us create our own lullaby for Plop the owl who was a fraid of the dark. We will also be using the computing equipment for research in English, History and DT.

Science: Lessons will be based on Science I (raising a question, predicting, planning a fair test, observing and concluding)..

PSHE: We will be learning about how we can learn best, and using this to become more independent in our learning.
