Looking at progress **Perry Hall had the highest progress for Mathematics** across all 69 Wolverhampton Schools and we were **ranked in the top 10 for progress in Reading.**

## School Uniform

If for any reason your child is not wearing the correct school uniform, please inform the class teacher of the reason why. To help prevent accidents, please ensure that your children do not wear shoes that have high or deep heels, or that are open backed. As far as possible, shoes should be flat bottomed to help to ensure your child's safety around school. Earrings should be restricted to one per ear and should be studs only. All earrings must be removed for PE lessons or you must provide your children with plasters to cover their studs if they cannot remove their own earrings. No other jewellery should be worn in school.

We would like to thank those parents who have ensured that their children have the correct PE kit for lessons. However, it has once again come to our attention that not all children are regularly bringing in their PE kit, or in some cases not wearing the correct kit. It is very important that your child is in the correct kit and footwear for their lesson. If your child forgets their kit or is not in the correct kit, then they will be provided with spare kit to wear for their PE lesson and a letter will be sent home to inform you.

## School Meals Reminders

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 (Early Years and Key Stage 1) are entitled to a free school meal via the Universal Free School Meal Programme.

Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 (Key Stage 2) must pay for their meals (unless they meet the criteria for a free school meal).

A school meal costs **£2.60 (£13.00 per week)**. If your child requires a school meal then this **must** be paid for in advance. This can be paid for via **Parentpay or Paypoint**. Where appropriate payment is not received, nor a packed lunch provided, the front office will phone parents to advise them that they must make a payment on Parentpay /Paypoint or provide a packed lunch before lunchtime, as meals will not be provided.
