## World Book Day Thursday 7th March



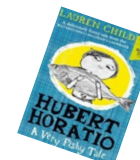
- Children are invited to come into school **dressed as one of their favourite book characters** from the story world or as an alternative, in their pyjamas or onesies ('bedtime story wear')
