# Year 3



## English

In English this term, we will be having a quick recap of last years skills before learning new writing skills to improve our own writing. We will be learning about compound sentences and how they work. We will also be learning about pronouns, adjectives and prepositions. We will practise these skills before applying them to our own writing.

Most importantly, we will be continuing to work on our spelling rules and handwriting to ensure our spelling is correct and our writing is legible.

We will be linking our writing to our topic work this term and we will be focusing on the text How to Train Your Dragon.

## Mathematics

In Mathematics this term, we will be learning many skills, including deepening our understanding of place value, as well as expanding our calculation methods. In particular we will develop our written methods for multiplication, addition and subtraction. We will be using previous skills to help us develop our reasoning and solve new problems.



We will also be extending our knowledge of time; reading, writing and estimating time.

We will be working statistics as well this term and learning how to record

## Science

In Science, we will be learning all about rocks and fossils We will look at different types of rocks and how they are formed.

We will also be looking at the composition of the Earth and how this has changed over time.

## History:

This term in History we will be learning about the plague, when it occurred and the causes - does the animal who caused the plague class as a predator?

## Geography:

We will be focusing on our Geography skills on locating the continents of the World and their relation to the British Isles. We will be identifying predators found in the different continents including Europe.

## D&T /Art/Music:

We will be looking at creating a moving dragon jaw, looking at the different types of hinge joints to create movement.

## MFL:

In MFL this term we will be learning some Spanish, such as greetings and questions. We will be able to talk about ourselves to answer these questions

## Computing:

In Computing this term, we will make links to our topic work of Predators by creating an animation of a predator hunting it's prey.

## RE:

In RE this term. we will be looking at 'The Golden Rule' in religions and introducing the 'Big Bang' and how this compares to religious beliefs.

## P.E./Games

In PE, we will be identifying ways to live healthy lifestyles and how physical activity contributes to this. We will also be designing a healthy meal plan.

## PSHE:

In PSHE, the children will be supported to understand their feelings and how to resolve conflicts. They also learn about eSatety and the importance of keeping themselves safe.
