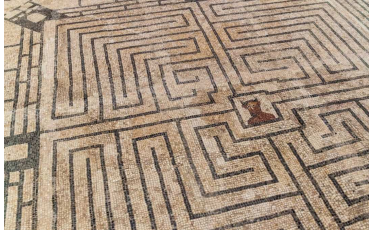


Labyrinth

We are going to be exploring Tudor Monarchs during the Autumn term. Our challenge to you is to build your very own Tudor castle.

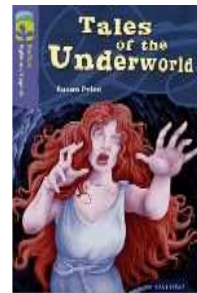

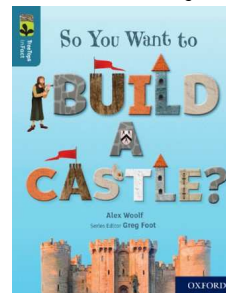

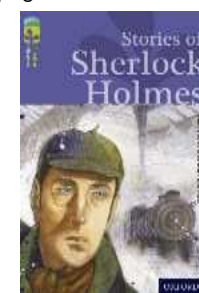
Your Year 5 teachers have been busy reading the books below. Go to the school website to hear them read the first couple of pages!
