
#### A message for Year 1 from the School Nursing Team

**Nursery:** 'Handa's Surprise' (Eileen Brown). The focus will be on African animals and food (particularly fruit).

**Reception:** My World, Your World (Melanie Walsh), identifying the richness of our similarities and differences.

**Year One:** Mary Seacole. A contemporary of Florence Nightingale, the children will be researching and compiling a timeline of her life and achievements.



**Year Two:** Barack Obama. An investigation into the life of a man who broke more than the one mould, when he became the 44th President of the U.S.A.

**Year Three:** Diana Ross. The life and music of the 'working-class' girl later named 'Female Entertainer of the Century' (American Billboard 1976)!

**Year Four:** Bob Marley. 'The man, the music, the legacy (and influence)'. The song '3 Little Birds' and how it inspires the world in the present times is also a focus!

Year Six: A focus on the biographies of influential black people across the world (e.g. Rosa Parks, Nelson Mandela) and what black music teaches us about black history!




## Are you this week's star of the week?
