

Year 2 – Summer Term– Commotion in the Ocean – How big is an ocean?

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 2 children will gain throughout this term's topic.



As readers we will:

Be continuing to develop our knowledge of comprehension through the use of guided reading. This term we will be focusing on retrieval, inference and language. We will then begin to develop our knowledge of the remaining domains.



As writers we will:

Be focusing on fictional/narrative forms of writing. We will be using a range of texts to complete different genres of writing such as a retell, letter and character description.



As mathematicians we will:

Be continuing to improve our knowledge of place value. We will look at different ways to partition 2-digit numbers. We will also be working on our addition, subtraction, multiplication and division skills. The formal methods for subtraction and addition will be used to support our knowledge development in addition and subtraction.

As scientists we will:

Be finding out about the needs of plants. We will be learning the life cycle of plants and how they reproduce. We will also learn about the needs of humans and other animals.



As historians we will:

• Research Mary Anning and find out who she is and why she is significant in our topic.



As geographers we will:

• Use maps to locate specific places in our school grounds.

• Use a compass correctly.

As artists and designers we will:

• Be working in the style of famous artists to recreate their work. We will be looking at different eras.



In PSHE we will:

- Understand how medicines can make people feel better and the safety issues involved.
- Understand how germs can spread and be prevented.
- Understand the stages of growth and what humans need to stay healthy.
- Name major internal body parts and describe how food, air and water get into the body and blood.
- Explain what privacy means.
- Identify which parts of the body are private.
- Understand humans mostly have the same body parts but they can look different from person to person.

In computing we will:

- Research and begin to understand the Terminology.
- Create a leaflet to give information on searching the internet



As musicians we will:

- Listen to and evaluate pieces of music.
- Create our own music to a given theme.



In PE we will:

- Look at fundamental movement of skills.
- Continue to improve our throwing and catching skills.



In RE we will:

- Learn about the Muslim religion
- Understand how people show their faith in different religions.


