

Year 6 – Summer Term– Transitions and Relationships – How do objects, services, behaviours and relationships develop and transition over time?



This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 6 children will gain throughout this term's topic.

As readers we will:

Continue to develop our language and retrieval skills and increase our focus on inference. All children still have access to Myon to support the development of basic reading skills as well as providing a range of texts to support their topic.

As mathematicians we will:

Be focusing on Geometry looking at the properties of 2D shapes and classifying them, studying angles of different shapes and recognising, describing and building simple 3-D shapes, including making nets. Later on in the term, we will be moving onto measurement, ratio, and proportion.

As writers we will:

First, we will be focusing on our narrative skills creating stories, diary entries and informal letters based on our class text 'The Hunger Games'.



In Summer 2 we will follow this up with non-fiction genres giving the children opportunities to develop their more formal writing skills.

As scientists we will:

Be exploring light: what it is and how it reflects. Children will be given opportunities to test concepts practically and evaluate their outcomes.

Look at the characteristics of individuals and see how they have developed and adapted over time.



As historians we will:

- Examine various sources to help us across the curriculum to see how things have transitioned from the 1930s to present day.
- Look at the changes in land use, geographical features and fashion over time.



As geographers we will:

- Look at how land use has transitioned over time, particularly focusing on the local area of Wednesfield.
- Compare the functions and uses of canals and rivers and how they have changed over time.

As artists we will:

- Research a famous artist (Piet Mondriaan).
- Look at how he transitioned from classic impressionism to the more abstract style De Stijl.



As designers we will:

- Explore the suitability of materials for a range of outfits for different time periods, terrains and weather.
- Design, create and evaluate our own outfit to meet a specific design brief.



As musicians we will:

- Explore the sounds of the mockingbird to create imitations.
- Look at how modern musicians use imitation to create their own versions of songs.



In PE we will:

Participate in:

- Team games
- Circuit training
- Dance and gymnastics.



In PSHE we will

- Be focusing on key topics in preparation for secondary school these include:
 - Basic First Aid
 - Growing and changing
 - Drugs education
 - Jobs and taxes.



In Computing we will:

- Continue to reflect on how we stay safe online.
- Enhance our subject knowledge across the curriculum by completing online research.
- Consolidate previously taught skills through Purple Mash activities.
- Learn how to use spreadsheets to manage a budget.

In Spanish we will:

- Learn how to pronounce the names of family members.
- Look at different types of food and how to pronounce them.
- Study different types of weather.
- Use Spanish to develop a conversation.

In RE we will:

- Look at how the local demographic has changed over time.
- Compare world religions and their identities.



At Perry Hall:


As part of our Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural curriculum we will continue to interweave our school motto and core values into everything we do.
