

Year 4 – Autumn Term – Rotten Romans – What did the Romans do for Britain?



This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 4 children will gain throughout this term's topic.

As readers we will:

Be introduced to new texts which focus around the Roman Era. Throughout this half term, we will be exploring various genres and revisiting our inference and retrieval skills to grasp an understanding of the text and their characters.

Revisit previous skills that have been taught in Year 3 by giving our children writing

opportunities. In the Autumn term, they will also be introduced to new skills in their focused

SPaG sessions and given the opportunity to embed these new skills within sustained pieces of



As mathematicians we will:

Start the new term by revising place value, introduce the teachings of rounding and negative numbers. The term will progress with the teachings of the 4 operations against formal written methods and embed their understanding by using 'jottings' throughout their work



As scientists we will:

Explore animals and living things. Children will be classifying the particular animal by observing their key features and characteristics. To link in with our Autumn term topic of the Romans, children will be asking how the Romans might have classified animals and why it would have been vital for them to do so.



As historians we will:

As writers we will:

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- Focus on the Roman era, understand who they were and what they set out to achieve.
- Gain an understanding of how the Romans lived and what they liked to do for fun.
- Identify where the Romans are placed ٠ chronologically.



- As geographers we will:
- Locate key areas of Rome by its distinguished shape.
- Explore the key areas of where the Romans attempted to invade.
- Identify and understand why the Romans created roads that we use today.

As artists and designers we will:

In art, we will be creating our own Roman mosaic, this will be achieved by exploring the history behind a mosaic, designing our mosaic and then creating and evaluating our piece.



In terms of D&T, we will design, create and evaluate a roman sandal fit for a Gladiator!

In computing we will:

• Use the software 2Logo to create our own logo, we will use this special software to create our own logo fit to represent the Roman army.



In Spanish we will:

Start the term by recapping the greetings we learnt previously in year 3 and then introduce new topics such as: parts of the body, fruits and zoo animals.



- Explain and explore religions.
- Identify key beliefs, celebrations, rituals, and holy buildings.



Identify the true meanings of holy stories.

In PSHE we will:

- Focus on personal growth set.
- Reflect on and celebrate our children, ٠ identifying their strengths and areas for improvement and set high aspirations and goals.



As musicians we will:

- Explore the historical instruments from the Romans.
- Create music together as an ensemble to compose the sounds of the Roman empire.


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IF YOU ARE ALWAYS 'GREEN'

We wanted to inform you that this year, in the Summer Term, your child will be sitting the multiplication tables check (MTC), which is statutory for primary schools in the 2021/22 academic year. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. There will be lots of preparation and focus upon children learning their times tables (up to 12x12) throughout this academic year, to ensure that they are as prepared as possible for this. Practice makes perfect, so any support you can offer at home to help your child learn their times tables would be much appreciated (including making use of Timestable Rockstars).
