Black History Month at Perry Hall 2021

Throughout October, the children of Perry Hall have been celebrating the achievements of influential black people.

Year 1 have looked at the life of Mary Seacole and the amazing work that she did as a nurse during the Crimean War. They have then produced some fantastic drawings of her both old and young.



Our Year 2 children have been discussing the importance of the actions taken by Rosa Parks in 1955. They have recognised the bravery it



took for her to stand up (or rather sit down) for what she believed in.

In Year 3, the children learnt about the 'hidden figures' who worked tirelessly at NASA, facing discrimination for being black and for being women, to achieve their goals. They focused on Mary Jackson, Katherine Johnson and Dorothy Vaughn and used artistic pencil techniques to sketch their faces.

Year 4 focused on discrimination and perseverance in politics. The children researched Nelson Mandela's life, imprisonment and achievements as well as Barack Obama's election campaign. They then created an art project inspired by Andy Warhol's pop art movement.



The children in Year 5 have imagined that they were passengers on the Empire Windrush in June 1949. After discussing cultural diversity and the reasons behind people moving from Jamaica to London, they have written diary entries from the perspective of the passengers.

Finally, as Year 6 have spent the autumn term studying World War 2, they have focused on the amazing achievements of Jesse Owens at the 1936 Berlin Olympics. They have discussed how he overcame the barriers he faced when competing and the determination and resilience he embodied. The children were then asked to create leaflets aimed at telling the world all about Jesse Owens.
