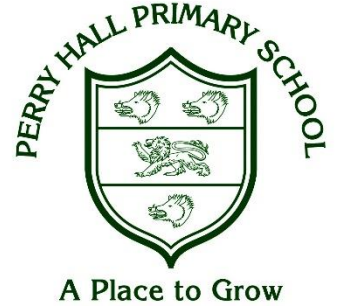

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# Itinerary - Day 1



- Leave school approx. 09:30 and arrive at Kingswood at 10:00am.
- Settling in, look around and then an activity 1.
- Lunch (picnic – children bring with them a packed lunch)
- Activity 2 & 3
- Free time (supervised)

- Free time (supervised)
- Trip down to the air raid shelter (optional)
- Hot chocolate and biscuits
- Approx. 21:00 - Bed

- Wake up approx. 07:30.
- Breakfast.
- Strip and remake the bed for the next group.
- Activity 4 & 5
- Hot dinner.
- Supervised free time.
- Return to school in time for normal home time.

- There is a vegetarian option available to all children.

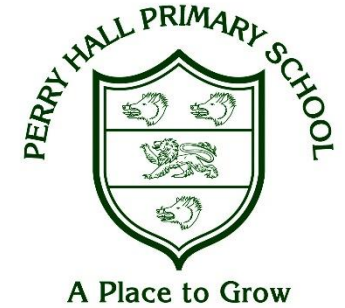


# Sleeping arrangements

- Children are allowed to bring a cuddly toy, family photo or anything else which they feel would make them more comfortable.
- Pupils will be sleeping in same gender dormitories containing between six and fourteen children. These groups will be selected by the teachers.
- Each dormitory will also have at least two adults.
- Pupils have easy access to toilets throughout the night and these will be pointed out to the pupils prior to them going to sleep.



# Other information



- There is a small gift shop which will be open in the evening.
- If you would like your child to purchase anything please provide them with **no more than £5** (preferably coins).  
Please provide this in a named and sealed envelope / container.
- We will only contact you in an emergency, but please make sure that you have provided us with up to date contact information and that you are able to receive a call if necessary.



# Keeping in contact

- We will inform the school that all pupils have arrived safely at Kingswood and parents will then receive a text message.
- We will also call school when we are leaving and parents will be informed by text message.



# Do's and do not's

## Do's

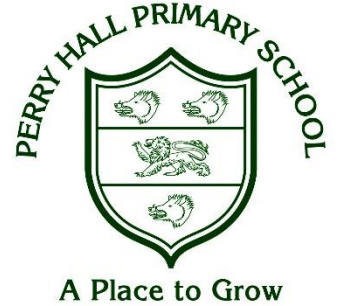
- Please make sure that all clothing and personal belongings are named. These are your child's responsibility.
- Please send your child in comfortable and practical clothing and footwear. It is not a fashion show, they will be getting dirty!
- Please make sure you have given us up to date contact and medical information on the forms provided.
- Encourage your child that this is a safe and exciting time, so they really need to try and have a go at as many activities as they can!

## Do not's

- Please don't 'overpack'. We are only away for two days and a night.
- Please don't send treats and mid-night snacks. There is plenty of food provided.
- No electronic equipment such as mobiles, gaming equipment and cameras are allowed.
- **DON'T WORRY AND ENJOY THE PEACE AND QUIET!**



# What happens next?



- **The cost of the trip will be £78**, which includes the transport to and from Kingswood. The cost of all other trips within Year 2 are kept to a minimal.
- A letter will go out on **Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November** asking for a deposit of **£10** which will need to be paid by **Friday 4<sup>th</sup> December** in order to secure your child's place on the residential.
- The remaining amount is to be paid in full by **Friday 4<sup>th</sup> March**. (this can however be paid in instalments between the deposit being paid and the beginning of March).
- Dates children will be going are:  
**Monday 6<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2022 (numbers dependant- if interest is high, we will go in two groups and also attend 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> June 2022).**

This is not a requirement for school groups, however may be used overnight if concerns are raised for any visitors on site.</p> <p><b>NHS Track and Trace</b></p> <p>There is now no requirement to use the QR code associated with Kingswood Trust. It is still in place as we have been advised to give people the option to continue checking in.</p>	<p>Employees/Volunteers/ Visitors/Children to be reminded on a regular basis to wash their hands for 20 seconds with water and soap and the importance of proper drying with disposable towels.</p> <p>Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands.
