Y2 experience day.....Fire, Fire!!

Year 2 took part in a Great Fire of London experience. During our workshop we met a baker, Thomas Farriner. He told us about his job in the bakery working for the king. We learnt about the conditions people lived in and what the houses were like. During our experience we learnt new vocabulary such as 'combustible'. We found out that it had been a very hot summer with no rain, and how this contributed to the spread of the fire. The baker explained how fire engines were not as we know them today which we found interesting. We also shared the learning we have been doing in class and shocked the baker with our knowledge! We took part in role play activities and experienced life in the Great Fire of London. Did you know...

- 13000 houses burnt down
- 5/6 of London were affected by the fire
- Explosives were used to create fire breaks.
