Number Day is a great way to make maths fun and bring about a positive, 'can-do' attitude towards it.

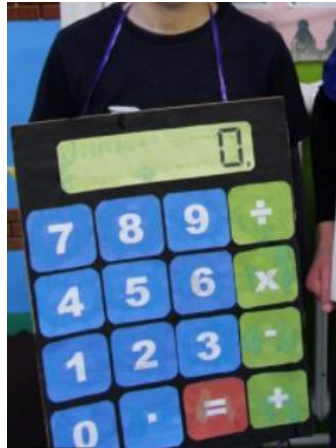
