

Covid Updates.

As the numbers of Covid-19 cases continue to rise within the local community, please use lateral flow device tests regularly and arrange a PCR test if

your child has Covid symptoms. As you will be aware, the self-isolation advice for people with coronavirus (COVID-19) has changed. It is now possible to end self-isolation after 5 full days if you have 2 negative LFD tests taken on consecutive days. The first LFD test should not be taken before the fifth day after your symptoms started (or the day your test was taken if you did not have symptoms). The self-isolation period remains 10 full days for those without negative results from 2 LFD tests taken a day apart. Changes to Isolation Periods

The isolation period is still 10 days but can be reduced to 5 days if you have a high temperature and a negative LFD test result. This means you can return to school or work after 5 days if you have a high temperature and a negative LFD test result. In any scenario, the isolation period can only end if your child no longer has a high temperature. This applies even if they have tested negative twice. If children still have a high temperature after Day 10, they should stay off school and seek medical advice such as contacting your GP or phoning 111.

Flu Vaccination—Catch Up Opportunity

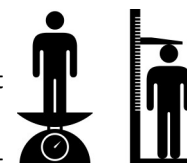
