These winners will be entered into our STEM fair where our governors and members of the MAT team will be invited to select a winner from each Key Stage on **Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> March**. If your child's project is entered into our STEM fair, family members will be invited to the fair to celebrate your child's entry, whilst agreeing to uphold our Covid-19 precautions.



In addition to our STEM projects, we would love for you to send in a **'Science Selfie'** of the children caught doing something scientific (could they be observing the nature in their garden? Taking part in identifying changes in materials when cooking? Exploring slime? Exploring in a museum?) along with a **#hashtag explaining their science learning and our science motto #wearescientists**. Each selfie entered will be added to our school display and the best entry will receive a prize.
