


Year 3's Food Technology Experience Day

On Monday (4th April) we celebrated World Autism Awareness Day in school.



Years 3 and 4 took part in fantastic workshops provided by the Outreach Team to raise awareness of Autism. Within these, the children looked at the autism ice cream sundae. We made an ice cream sundae and each part of the sundae represented a challenge that may be faced by autistic people. We used the idea of a spoon making the scoops smaller as a way of looking at how we can support autistic people with these challenges. Pupils were able to identify parts of the ice cream sundae and say what challenge this represented for autistic people.

Within other year groups, children carried out a range of discussions and a variety of activities and stories that developed their understanding of Autism.


