This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Two's children will gain throughout this half term's topic.

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As readers we will:

- Learn new stories •

- Learn to recognise our name and begin to follow the words.

- Move in different ways using play equipment.
- Enjoy and take part in action songs.

- Create models and talk about what we have made.

- As talkers we will:
 - Use instruments to create different sounds. •
 - Talk about what we can see and hear.
 - Join in with circle time activities like talking about what we can see in a book/ which song they would like to choose.
