

Year 4 – Summer Term – The Vicious Vikings! – What did the Vikings do for Britain?

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 4 children will gain throughout this term's topic.



As readers we will:

Be introduced to new texts which focus around the Vikings. Throughout this half term we will be exploring various genres and revisiting our inference and retrieval skills to grasp an understanding of the text and their characters. Our first novel will be 'How To Train Your Dragon'.



As mathematicians we will:

Start the new term by revisiting our understanding of reading, writing and converting analogue and digital times. We will then move on to estimating and comparing measurements of money. We will also be preparing for the upcoming multiplication times table check.



As writers we will:

Revisit previous skills that have been taught in Year 4 by allowing children to apply them in various writing opportunities. In the Summer term, they will also be introduced to new skills in their focused SPaG sessions and given the opportunity to embed these new skills within sustained pieces of writing.



As scientists we will:

Explore and investigate animals including humans. During this topic, we will explore functions of different human teeth, naming and identifying the basic parts of the human body which aid in the human digestive system.



As historians we will:

- Focus on the Viking era, understanding who they were and what they set out to achieve.
- Identifying where the Vikings are placed chronologically.
- Understanding the Vikings by exploring the culture, religion and political views of that time.

As geographers we will:

- Understand where the Vikings came from.
- Investigate why the Vikings migrated.
- Comparing Scandinavia to the UK.
- Understanding how the Vikings became successful tradesmen.

As artists and designers we will:

- In Art, we will be focussing on portraiture and turning ourselves into Viking warriors!
- In terms of D&T, we will design, create and evaluate our own spiced, honey and oat cakes ready for a medieval feast.



In computing we will:

- Be exploring creating our very own animations using 2Animate.
- Using 'stop motion' animation to create our own Viking film.



In Spanish we will:

 Explore how to say our favourite hobbies in Spanish. To aid us with our learning, we will practise using songs, rhymes and stories.



In RE we will:

- Explain and explore religions. (in particular, the Islamic faith).
- Identifying key beliefs, celebrations, rituals, temples and holy places.
- Identify the true meanings of holy stories.



In PSHE we will:

Focus on ways to keep ourselves safe, through looking at peer pressure, identifying what is dangerous, a risk or a hazard.



As musicians we will:

- Explore the various songs of the Viking era.
- Improvising and composing music which is inspired by the Gods and Goddesses of Viking mythology.



In PE we will:

- Learn about health-related fitness and why it is important to utilise it during sport and everyday life.
- Play a range of multi-skill sports.



At Perry Hall:


As part of our Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural curriculum we will continue to interweave our school motto and core values into everything we do.




If you end your day on a 'Gold Card', you will receive a sticker on your bookmark.
