

### Collecting your child from Nursery

You will be required to inform the office of a password for your child and the person(s) who will regularly collect your child from school at the end of the day. That person will be asked for the password if not familiar to the staff dismissing. **If any other person will be collecting your child you must inform the office before the end of the Nursery session, that person will be required to show proof of identity and know the password.** This is done to ensure the safety of all of our children.

### Change of Details

If you change your address, telephone number or any of the emergency contact numbers, it is important you let us know as soon as possible. It would be helpful if you do this via the school office.

### Attendance

Regular school attendance is essential if children are to achieve their full potential. Good attendance in the early years supports early childhood development and early intervention. We believe that regular attendance enables children both to maximise the educational opportunities available to them and to become responsible, organised and motivated learners. We value all pupils and promote high attendance across our school.

### Absences

It is vital that you notify the school by telephone in the first instance. If a message is not received, the absence is marked as unauthorised and a home visit may occur to check that your child is safe. We are also monitoring and acting upon persistent lateness. For absences over 3 days, evidence of medication could be requested.

### Medication

If your child requires medication in school it must be sent in via the school office so that the appropriate forms can be completed. If your child has ANY special medical needs please see your class teacher to discuss them. Medication must be prescribed and in its original packaging.

## Snacks



Children will be provided with a healthy snack and a carton of milk each day (Please make us aware of any known allergies).

Children are encouraged to bring a named bottle of water/ flavoured water each day. We ask that this is not fizzy drinks or squash as we are a healthy school.

You may also wish to send your child into Nursery with their own healthy snack e.g. fruit, vegetables or other healthy alternatives.

## Packed Lunch

If your child stays for our 30 hours provision your child should bring a packed lunch. Can you please ensure that the lunch box contains a healthy lunch which may include a sandwich or equivalent, drink (not fizzy) and items of your child's choice (not sweets). To support our school's eco-school award please consider the use of reusable containers for your child's food to reduce the amount of non-reusable plastics.

## Healthy Snacks & Lunchbox

P2IP

Bring WATER everyday!

Putting tap water in a reusable bottle is FREE and will help keep your child hydrated all day!



<b>Whole Grains</b> <small>(Great for bread or snacks)</small> Make sandwiches with whole grain bread. Look for labels that say "100% Whole Grain".	<b>Fruit</b> <small>(Great for snack or lunch)</small> Pack fresh fruit each day for snack and lunch. These are easy, convenient ways to add fruits to your day.
<b>Snacks</b> Pack healthy snacks each day. Add a healthy sweet or savory treat. Try whole grain crackers and pretzels for savory snacks or dried fruits for sweet treats.	<b>Veggies</b> <small>(Great for snack or lunch)</small> Add veggies in your child's lunch. They add a healthy crunch instead of chips.

Please note - Perry Hall is a no nut school, please do not send in anything containing nuts.



## Nursery Times:

Please enter via the EYFS gate leading your child into the Early Years garden, across the path and into Nursery where a member of staff will be waiting.

**Morning Nursery** - Our Nursery doors are open between 8.30am and 8:45am. The register closes at 8:50am, therefore any child arriving after this time will receive a late mark. Circle time activities are in place from 8:45am, please ensure your child is in Nursery on time so that no learning time is lost. The Nursery doors will re-open at 11:15am until 11:30am for releasing.

**Afternoon Nursery** - Our Nursery doors are open between 12:15pm and 12:30pm. The register closes at 12:35pm, therefore any child arriving after this time will receive a late mark. Circle time activities are in place from 12.30pm, please ensure your child is in Nursery on time so that no learning time is lost. The Nursery doors will re-open at 3pm until 3:15pm for releasing.

## Extended School Paid Provision

Breakfast club runs from 7.45am daily.

After school club runs from 3.15-5.55pm (a shorter session runs until 4.15pm).

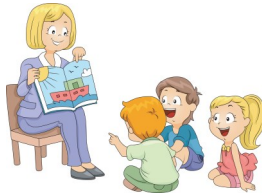
Please note that Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October, Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June and Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July are INSET days.

# Getting Ready for Nursery...

There are lots of ways to help your child get ready for Nursery. Here are some key skills you can practice together at home...

Ask a grown-up to help you practice:

- Using the toilet,
- Washing and drying your hands,
- Putting on your coat and shoes,
- Zipping and fastening buttons,
- Talking about stories that you've read together; talking about the front cover and the pictures from the book, talking about the marks on the page, hearing and using new words,
- Asking simple questions and talking in sentences,
- Following simple instructions, such as collecting or putting away an object,
- Saying number names in order to five,
- Talking about people who are special to you,
- Talking about what you see in the world around you,
- Playing make believe games by pretending,
- Creating sounds and singing songs and rhymes.



To support your child's learning at home a topic grid of activities which your child may wish to participate in will be distributed each term.



In Nursery the children will complete the following topics: through the year:

**Autumn Term:** Me, My Family, My World

**Spring Term:** How does your Garden Grow?

**Summer Term:** We're going on a Journey
