To take part, children can come into school, out of uniform, and wear yellow to school on Monday 10th October. This can be a yellow hair band, hair bobble, badge, socks, t-shirt, jumper etc. They can even come in fancy dress and dress as a minion or a banana if they wish! The colour yellow is meant to represent happiness and positivity. 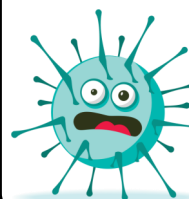


Pre Loved School Uniform and Winter Coats
