

Year 3 – Spring Term – Rock Stars – How are rocks and fossils made?

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 3 children will gain throughout this term's topic.



As readers we will:

Be exploring a range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry and using our KS2 reading domains to develop our confidence and understanding. We will particularly focus on retrieval, language and inference skills and will practice reading independently and collaborately to build confidence.



As mathematicians we will:

Be developing our knowledge of multiplication and division ahead of next year's Multiplication Tables Check. This term this will mainly focus on the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. In addition to this, we will revisit fractions using pictures to help us at first, and we will also look at telling the time.



As writers we will:

Be embedding our knowledge from the Autumn term, whilst introducing new skills to our writing such as expanded noun phrases with post modifiers. We will look at a range of text genres including narrative settings, letters and fact files. We will also develop our writing stamina as well as working on our handwriting presentation.



As scientists we will:

Be learning about different rocks, This includes the comparing rocks around their appearance and physical properties. We will also be finding out all about fossils and how they are formed. We will work scientifically to ask our own questions and carry out our own experiments to find our answers.




As historians we will:

- Develop our concept of time and chronology by looking at how events unfold across time.
- Find out more about the history of our local area through a case study.

As geographers we will:

 Practice map reading skills and develop our knowledge of the world.



As artists and designers we will:

 Learn about famous artists who used printing and reflect on their work.

 Use different artistic methods, techniques and resources creatively. This includes different printing techniques and use of colour.

In computing we will:

 Increase our confidence in using IT independently, including how to access the internet, search effectively using a search engine and presenting key information. Using IT safely and sensibly will underpin all of these sessions.

At Perry Hall:


As part of our Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural curriculum we will continue to interweave our school motto and core values into everything we do.

We strive to adopt a fair approach to behaviour management within our school, offering a range of motivational rewards to help keep positive behaviour on track.



- *Each day, children start fresh on 'blank'.
- *If rules and core values are being adhered to, then the children will move up through the green triangle (rewards explained on the right).
- *If rules and core values are not being adhered to, then children will move down through the red triangle (consequences explained below).
- *Children can move up and down both the red and green triangle throughout the course of the day.
- *A purple card cannot be earned back.

You can receive a 'Platinum Card' for going 'above and beyond' - you will receive a sticker on your bookmark, a certificate and a prize.



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If you end your day on a 'Gold Card', you will receive a sticker on your bookmark.

When you have collected all of the stickers on the front of your bookmark, you will receive:

- a certificate
- a dip in the prize box.

When you have collected all of the stickers on the back of your bookmark, you will receive:

- an invite for your grown-ups to join us in a celebration assembly (when assemblies are restarted)
- · a certificate and a badge.

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
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IF YOU ARE ALWAYS 'GREEN' At the end of each half term, if you have managed to stay 'green' for that half term, you will receive a 'treat activity'.
