- Provide a safe, secure and caring learning environment.
- Teach and encourage children to do their best at all times, achieve their full potential and raise their aspirations.
- Develop positive values and a caring attitude towards the school community and the environment.
- Provide a balanced curriculum of the highest quality and meet the individual needs of every child.
- Promote high standards of behaviour, following our 'Good to be Green' behaviour scheme.
- Keep parents informed about school activities through newsletters, notices, website etc.
- Support children's social, emotional and mental health needs and educate children regarding their own wellbeing, safety and dangers online.
- Monitor the progress of children and provide advice and guidance to support their work.
- Set regular homework and mark it if appropriate.
- Be welcoming and offer opportunities for parents/carers to become involved in the daily life of the school.
- Treat children fairly, care for them well and ensure their happiness.
- Help children to develop a sense of responsibility, be considerate of others, and support them to make the right choices.
- Encourage good attendance and punctuality and recognise this with rewards and certificates.
- Involve parents/carers in the celebration of children's successes and achievements.

# Parent/Carer's Agreement

I/We will do my/our best to:

- Ensure my child attends school everyday and is punctual to reduce gaps in learning due to absence. An explanation for the absence will be provided if my child is absent.
- Support the school to ensure that my child maintains good behaviour.
  I am aware of the Good to be Green behaviour scheme and policy in place for children in Year 1-6 (introduced to Reception in the Summer Term).
- Ensure that my child wears the correct school uniform or PE kit on their designated day (including no nail varnish, no fake nails, no make-up and natural coloured hair only).
- Encourage my child to always do their best.
- Ensure that my child's homework is completed and returned on time.
- Attend achievement assemblies, parent workshops and parent meetings to discuss your child's progress.
- Work in partnership with the school, supporting the school in upholding its standards and policies.
- Support all staff in their efforts to create a caring community which values children and their rights.
- Treat all members of the school community with respect and politeness (ensuring I have read and understood the 'Parent/Carer Conduct on Site' information below) and encourage mutual respect between pupils and all staff by modelling positive behaviours at all times.
- Respect the decisions made by school, understanding that the safety and welfare of children and staff must come first.
- Inform the school of any medical or dietary needs, or any concerns or problems that might affect my child.
- Ensure my contact details are up to date and school are fully informed of any changes to end of day collection arrangements.
- Monitor my child's use of the internet and social networking sites, ensuring age restrictions and advice given on e-safety are adhered to.

## **Child's Agreement**

### I will do my best to:

- Always work hard to learn.
- Come to school everyday and arrive on time.
- Behave well and be polite and helpful to others.
- Follow the school rules and our school core values, embracing the school's Good to be Green scheme.
- Be polite, friendly and show respect to all.
- Look after others.
- Take responsibility for myself and my actions.
- Always tell a member of staff about my problems/concerns that stop me from feeling safe and happy.
- Do my homework and return it on time.
- Bring all the equipment I need every day including my book bag and reading books.
- Wear the correct school uniform with pride and be a school ambassador whenever I wear it.
- Keep long hair tied back and not wear jewellery (except a single pair of stud earrings or for religious reasons).
- Not wear make-up, nail varnish, fake nails, temporary tattoos or have unnatural hair colour (except during special events such as fundraising or dressing up days).
- Take good care of the school equipment, school environment and living things.
- Always try my best!

#### **Parent/Visitor Conduct On Site**

Parents/carers and visitors are expected to treat all staff and children in a respectful way when on our school site. Any threatening, abusive or violent behaviour against any staff member or child is taken extremely seriously. Examples of such behaviour are below:

- raised voices
- shouting at staff
- swearing
- intimidating staff
- rallying other parents to become involved in intimidating behaviour
- publicly voicing unsubstantiated claims about staff, children or the Academy.
- using racist or sexist terms
- using violence
- taking alcohol or drugs on the premises
- wilful damage to school property
- theft
- threats or threatening behaviour
- altercations (verbal or physical towards other parents whilst on the school site).

This list is not an exhaustive list but seeks to provide illustrations of such behaviour that is not acceptable in our school.

Anyone behaving in this way will be asked to leave the premises and the police will be called if verbal or physical harassment occurs. If necessary, action will be taken to ban anyone behaving in such a way from the school grounds. This Home-School Agreement is accompanied by our school consent form. Please read both of these documents carefully...
