

Year 2 Spring Term 2024

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 2 children will gain throughout this term.

As explained at the 'Meet the Teacher' meeting, we will no longer be focussing on 'topics' but learning through individual subjects



As readers we will:

This year we are starting an exciting new programme called Talk for

Writing, which is a whole school approach to develop our

children as readers, writers, speakers and listeners.

Furthermore, the programme enables children to read and

write independently for a range of purposes and for a variety of audiences

As writers we will:

Through Talk For Writing, pupils will develop their writing skills through imitation, innovation and independent application.

We will be writing a character description based on Goldilocks & the Three Bears. We will also do some non-fiction writing.

As mathematicians we will:

We will begin to understand multiplication, firstly through doubling and then linking this to the concept of arrays. We will begin to understand division through grouping and sharing small quantities. We will begin to recognise, find and name one half and one guarter of a shape.

As scientists we will:

We will be learning about 'animals, including humans'. In Spring 1 we will learn how to identify, name, draw and label basic parts of the human body. In Spring 2 we will learn how to identify and name a variety of common animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. We will also identify and name a variety of common animals that are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores.

As historians we will:

- In Spring 2 we will explore our unit 'Kings, **Oueens and Leaders'**
- We will place events on a timeline •

events such as the sealing of the

Magna Carta by King John in 1215.

We will learn about significant national

As geographers we will:

- In Spring 1 we will explore our unit 'The UK'
- We will learn about the name, location and characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom.
- We will learn about the formation of the Union Jack.
- We will use maps and atlases to find locations in the United Kingdom

As artists we will:

- We will be exploring our unit 'Architecture'
- We will recreate famous London landmarks (St Paul's Cathedral/The Houses of Parliament/Westminster Abbey) using line drawings, collage and clay.



We will make the link between the purpose of a building and its features from an architectural point of view and use this knowledge to design a penguin house inspired by the modernist penguin house at London Zoo.

In computing we will:

Learn how to use technology safely and respectfully including the importance of keeping private information private.

As designers we will:

In Spring 2 we will make sock puppets. We will follow the design-make-evaluate process to create sock puppets based on animals.

In RE we will:

- We will learn about 'How and why are some books holy?'.
- We will learn special stories of Christians, Sikhs and Muslims.

In PSHE we will:



*Each day, children start fresh on 'blank'.


