

Year 4 Spring Term 2024

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 4 children will gain throughout this term.



As readers we will:

Focus on a range of genres and reading domains such as retrieval, language, inference, content, summarising and predicting.



As mathematicians we will:

Begin by revising place value, exploring tenths and hundredths and introducing roman numerals.

The term will progress with the teaching of decimals through numeral form and being linked to money. We will revisit shape, recapping prior knowledge and then building on this by looking at angles and symmetry.

As writers we will:

This year we have started an exciting new programme called Talk for Writing, which is a whole school approach to develop our children as readers, writers, speakers and listeners. Furthermore, the programme enables children to read and write independently for a range of purposes and for a variety of audiences. We will continue to develop as writers by using the Talk For Writing frameowrk, This term, we will be focusing on both fiction and non-fiction writing based on the story of Beowulf.

As scientists we will:

Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating; recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear; find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it; and find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it

As historians we will:

- Explore the substantive concepts of empire, civilisation, power, monarchy, government and democracy.
- Investigate the disciplinary concepts of similarities and differences of the life of people in Ancient Rome and sources and evidence.

In computing we will:

 Continue to learn about input and out devices on a range of devices.
 Once completed, children will

As geographers we will:

- Build on our knowledge of Mediterranean Europe by looking at eastern Europe.
- Explore interconnection, climate and conflict.
- Investigate the location of countries and how that impacts their climate, the environment and how the country trades.






We strive to adopt a fair approach to behaviour management within our school, offering a range of motivational rewards to help keep positive behaviour on track.
