


Year 5 – Spring Term 2024



This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 5 children will gain throughout this term.

As readers we will:



and continuing to work on all of our domains, practicing retrieval, language and inference strategies before beginning to explore further content and summarise and prediction questions.

As writers we will:

Continue to explore our Talk for Writing programme and the imitation, innovation and independent application stages. Within this, we will focus on both fiction and non-fiction writing, with some exciting text maps and stimuli to inspire our writing. We will be basing our work on the story of Icarus.

As mathematicians we will:

Add and subtract fractions, explore mixed numbers and improper fractions and convert fractions. Following this, we will read and write decimal numbers as fractions and explore these as percentages. In addition, we will continue to practice calculations surrounding the four operations.

As scientists we will:

Explore the properties of materials and be delving into what dissolving is and how it happens. Following this, we will look at what mixtures and solutions are and discover how particles in these can be separated. We will also recognise and describe reversible changes.



As historians we will:

Explore the Transatlantic Slave Trade and The Industrial Revolution.

Investigate how these changed British society and the effects they had on the growth of our nation.

In computing we will:

Explore selection in physical computing and flatfile databases, through both practical and theoretical learning contexts, using a range of technology, including crumble kits and laptops.

As geographers we will:

Investigate, research and explore Australia and New Zealand as countries.

Conduct depth studies into the physical features, the culture and famous figures of these nations.

In Spanish we will:

Learn the names of food and drink, how to write the date, and explore how to say the names of family members, pets and animals.



As artists and designers we will:

Research. discuss and create art inspired by Western African art and explore 3D form and drawing. Following this, we will develop our understanding of Chinese painting and ceramics and use our painting skills to have a go at replicating this,



In RE we will:

Continue our exploration of prayer, including Islamic prayer, and discover how this is done by Jews, Hindus and Muslims.

PE days & Uniform Reminder:


This term, your child's PE day is a Wednesday (5MJ) and Thursday (5JP).

celebration assembly (when assemblies are restarted)




• a certificate and a badge.
