

# Reception – Summer Term – 2024 – What will I be?

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Reception children will gain throughout this term's topics 'Kings and Oueens' and 'Stories from the past'



### As readers we will:

- Use our phonic knowledge to read simple words, phrases and sentences.
- Recognise and read Reception high frequency words.
- Explore non fiction texts.
- Talk about the characters, setting and the plot of a a story we have heard or read.



### As mathematicians we will:

- continue to develop our counting skills, counting larger sets as well as counting actions and sounds.
- explore a range of representations of numbers, including the 10-frame, and see how doubles can be arranged in a 10-frame.
- compare quantities and numbers, including sets of objects which have different attributes.
- continue to develop a sense of magnitude, e.g. knowing that 8 is quite a lot more than 2, but 4 is only a little bit more than 2.



### As writers we will:

- Use our phonic knowledge to write simple sentences. using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
- Form letters using the correct size and orientation.
- Learn to write Reception high frequency words.



## As investigators we will:

- Learn about our past and present monarchy.
- Explore different religions, cultures and communities throu
- Continue to develop our knowledge of the seasons.



## As individuals we will:

- Ask appropriate questions of others.
- Problem solve, to resolve conflict.
- Self-regulate our emotions and take other people's emotions into consideration.
- Be helpful to friends and family.



## As movers we will:

- Experiment with different ways of moving.
- Travel with confidence and skill.
- Use a knife and fork to cut up food.
- Do up zips and buttons on our coats.
- Use scissors effectively and precisely.

### As creators we will:

- Create our own stories in play and use narrative.
- Use props to support story telling.
- Learn a range of songs from different cultures.
- Explore sounds of different instruments.
- Explore colour mixing.
- Make models using different junk materials.





- Use connective words in sentences to link thoughts.
- Answer how and why questions.
- Understand the skills of listening and why it is important.
- Listen and respond appropriately to questions being asked and take account of what is being said.
- Learn and apply new vocabulary.
- Describe events in detail using sequencing words (before, after, next, later, tomorrow).
