

Year 2 Summer Term 2024

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 2 children will gain throughout this term.



As readers we will:

Continue to develop our skills in language, retrieval and inference. We will be developing our inference skills and looking at prediction and summarising different texts, Some children will continue to work on the RWI phonics scheme.

As mathematicians we will:



Begin to learn about fractions of quantities and shapes. We will also learn about different types of measurement such as mass, length and temperature.

As writers we will:

Be basing our writing on Pattan's Pumpkin, a story about a pumpkin that grows and saves everyone from a flood. Our focus will be openings and endings, where we will write a fiction and non-fiction piece of writing around the story.

As scientists we will:

Begin learning about plants and investigating what helps plant grow in different environments. We will be using our observation skills to identify which is the best environment for plants to thrive in and will be making observations over time.



As historians we will:

Be learning about powerful voices from the past such as Martin Luther King and Rosa Parks. We will learn about their achievements and how this has had an impact on life today.

As geographers we will:

Be learning about Northern Europe and learning how to identify its location on a map. We will also learn about how people and animals have adapted to the cold winters in Norther Europe.

As artists we will:

Be studying history painting which will help retell stories from the past including mythology and stories from the Bible. We will also carry out a detailed study on the work of Picasso.



In computing we will:

Be linking this to our music lessons and learning about digital music.



As designers we will:

Be creating our own moving pictures and learning how to create and use levers and sliders.

In RE we will:

Be focusing on questions that puzzle us and taking part in discussions and debates about different topics.



In PSHE we will:

Be learning about growing and changing and focusing on the human life cycle. We will learn about the different stages and the changes that happen to our bodies.



As musicians we will:

Be exploring improvisation and learning how to make up our own songs using rhythm and different instruments.



In PE we will:

Be taking part in different target games. We will focus on learning skills and using these within the games. We will also be practising for our last KS1 sports day!

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
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IF YOU ARE ALWAYS 'GREEN'
