

Year 3 - Summer Term 2024



This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 3 children will gain throughout this term.

As readers we will:

Be focusing on a love story. We will explore friendship and love. In our new reading cycle we will be getting a deep understanding of the vocabulary in the text and using our reading skills to answer questions. We will also be taking part in book talk to express our veiws and oppinions on the text.

As mathematicians we will:

Be developing our knowledge of division and multiplication within our 3, 4 and 8s. We will continue our addition and subtraction calculations using mental and written strategies. We will also learn about money by recognising coins and notes. We will continue to learn more about telling the time. We will use our 5 times tables facts to help us when telling the time both analogue and digital.

As writers we will:

Be embedding our knowledge on story writing. We will be focussing our writing on the book The Steadfast Tin Soldier using our description toolkit for talk for writing. We will carry on using the Talk 4 writing to help us embed our understanding through acting the text out before co-constructing the toolkit. These toolkit skills will include similes, personification, expanded noun phrases and metaphors.

As scientists we will:

Develop our knowledge around light and shadows. We are going to carry out investigations about how a shadow is formed. During this investigation, we will be able to recognise the change in the size of shadows. We will also be able to describe what dark is (absence of light) and know we need light to be able to see things. We will investigate types of resources which are reflective which are good to wear in the dark.

As historians we will:

Continue to learn about all the different ways history can be understood by looking at artefacts and historical periods from different perspectives. We will also look at various periods such as the Anglo Saxons, Vikings and Scots.

As geographers we will:

Find out about the different parts of and paths of rivers, including where they start and end up. We will explore rivers from across the world and learn about why they are important

As artists and designers we will:

Learn about the Anglo-Saxon art. We will use a variety of artistic materials and methods to show our skills. We will create a clay tile and we will also design and carefully paint an Anglo-Saxon shoulder clasp.

In computing we will:

Practice using different software to make images and sprites moving, using coding. We will develop our understanding of sequencing sounds.

Then understand data branching through grouping and questioning

In Spanish we will:

Learn about weather and months of the year. Express ourselves artistically with Spanish colours!



In RE we will:

Learn about the importance of religious leaders.

We are going to be learning all about Sikhism and religious leaders Sikh Granthi.

In PSHE we will:

Learn about the importance of trying our best,

Develop our skills and embrace our different talents and be able to recognise that everyone is different.



As musicians we will:

Listen to a range of music and explore the beat and tempo of the music.

We will practice in groups and all together to sing songs to the correct beat and pitch.

In PE we will:

Learn about different footballing techniques and rules.
Understand the importance of teamwork and sportsmanship.

We strive to adopt a fair approach to behaviour management within our school, offering a range of motivational rewards to help keep positive behaviour on track.

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- *Each day, children start fresh on 'blank'.
- *If rules and core values are being adhered to, then the children will move up through the green triangle (rewards explained on the right).
- *If rules and core values are not being adhered to, then children will move down through the red triangle (consequences explained below).
- *Children can move up and down both the red and green triangle throughout the course of the day.
- *A purple card cannot be earned back.

You can receive a 'Platinum Card' for going 'above and beyond' - you will receive a sticker on your bookmark, a certificate and a prize.



If you end your day on a 'Gold Card', you will receive a sticker on your bookmark.

When you have collected all of the stickers on the front of your bookmark, you will receive:

- · a certificate
- a dip in the prize box.

When you have collected all of the stickers on the back of your bookmark, you will receive:

- an invite for your grown-ups to join us in a celebration assembly (when assemblies are restarted)
- · a certificate and a badge.

Places on the 'Wheel of Praise' are on offer at all times for showing a good attitude and lots of effort. At the end of each day, the 'Wheel of Praise' will be spun in each classroom and the winner will receive a dip in the prize box.





IF YOU ARE ALWAYS 'GREEN' At the end of each half term, if you have managed to stay 'green' for that half term, you will receive a 'treat activity'.




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Other Year Group Specific Information:
