

Year 4 Summer Term 2024

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 4 children will gain throughout this term.



As readers we will:

Focus on a range of genres, whilst focusing on specific readinging domains (Such as, retrieval, language, inference, content and summarising and predicition). A wide range of texts will be studied throughout the term. We will



continue to use the library and select books we would like to read both at school and at home.

As writers we will:

Continue to explore our Talk for Writing programme through the imitation, innovation and independent application stages. Within this, we will focus on both fiction and non-fiction writing, with some exciting text maps and stimuli to inspire our writing. We will be basing our work on the story 'The real story of the three little pigs.'

As mathematicians we will:

Continue to work on fractions and then steadily progress on to decimals when we are ready. By working in this sequence, it wil help us prepare for the unit of money before finally moving onto shape, statistics and then time to conclude the year.

As scientists we will:

Complete our study of habitats and explore these first hand at The Wildside Activity Centre. We will then move onto looking at states of mater with reversible and irreversible change through gases, solids and liquids. During this time, we will conduct many scientific enquiries to help us explore and understand.

As historians we will:

Explore The Stuarts and monumental British leaders and events during this time such as:

- Charles 1
- lames 1
- Oliver Cromwell The Plague

As geographers we will:

Look at the geography of the UK, specifically focusing on the capital city of London and the South East. During these lessons we will learn about the human and geographical features of this location.



As artists and designers we will:

Be looking at monuments from the Byzantine empire, also known as the Eastern Roman Empire. We will learn about the history of the Hagia Sophia and create our own similar patterns using watercolour and gold paint. We will then study the renowned mosaics of Ravenna in Northern Italy – from here, we will create our own mosaic portraits using paper, focusing on different skin tones.

In computing we will:

The British civil war.



Continue to work on repetition in shapes using relevant software before moving onto data logging.

In Spanish we will:



Be looking at the different types of weather and will practice weather phrases to answer the question, 'What's the weather like?' Children will practise the vocabulary in a range of interactive activities, and they will learn to orally present a weather forecast for a selection of UK cities.

In RE we will:

Be exploring different religious places of worship and understanding how they are special to different religions. We will also take an interest in sacred items of religion and aim to visit a local place of worship.



In PSHE we will:

Focus on being the best we can be! Think about the choices we make and how these can have a positive impact on the people we encounter on a daily basis.



As musicians we will:

Continue to explore a variety of different music genres. We will be practicing how to sing in time to the beat and will be adding musical instruments to their songs.



In PE we will:

Begin to take on a 12-week programme of swimming. We will first be assessed and then complete structured lessons, gaining confidence in the water.



Uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to our school ethos and helps to set an appropriate tone.


PE days & Uniform Reminder:




We strive to adopt a fair approach to behaviour management within our school, offering a range of motivational rewards to help keep positive behaviour on track.
